Subject: Request from the International Criminal Court to arrest Omar al-Bashir

On 14 June 2015 a South African court ordered the South African authorities not to let President Omar al-Bashir of Sudan leave the country until the courts had taken a decision on the request for his arrest sent to Pretoria by the International Criminal Court (ICC), which on 28 May had reminded South Africa that, as a State Party to the ICC Rome Statute, it had an obligation to arrest Omar al-Bashir and hand him over to the ICC if he entered South African territory.

Mr al-Bashir has been indicted for war crimes, crimes against humanity, and genocide, and the ICC has issued two warrants for his arrest, one in 2009 and a second in 2010.

- 1. What is the Commission's attitude to the ICC's request to South Africa?
- 2. Can the European External Action Service exert pressure on the international community to ensure that Omar al-Bashir will be arrested and handed over to the ICC in order to stand trial?
