Subject: Impact of the OLAF report on the management of European funds

Romania is the country in which the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) carried out the largest number of investigations into the use of European funds in 2014, followed at some distance by Hungary and Bulgaria, according to the report on OLAF's activities last year. This does not necessarily mean that corruption and fraud have increased, but it shows the increased trust placed in OLAF by institutions and the public. Thus the report notes that OLAF received 458 items of information from public sources and 959 from private sources last year.

How does the Commission interpret the report drawn up by OLAF for 2014 with regard to the management of European funds in Romania?
