Subject: Follow-up of the Victoire Ingabie case since the adoption of Resolution 2013/2641(RSP)

On 23 May 2013 the European Parliament adopted a resolution on the case of Victoire Ingabie in Rwanda (2013/2641(RSP)). The resolution condemned the conditions surrounding the trial and sentencing of Victoire Ingabie and, among other things, called on the EU to send in observers.

The situation has further deteriorated since the resolution was approved. On Friday 10 July, Mrs Ingabie's books were confiscated and she is no longer allowed to receive visitors. Nor is she permitted to speak to the people who bring her her food.

1. The resolution criticised the party political use of the 2008 law on genocide ideology. Is this law still in force? What has the Commission done to bring pressure to bear on the Rwandan Government as called for by Parliament?
2. How many times has the EU Delegation to Rwanda asked to visit Mrs Ingabie since then?
