Question for written answer E-012548/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Pablo Zalba Bidegain (PPE)

Subject: Harmonisation of food safety legislation

Earlier this year the European Food Safety Authority stated in a report that bisphenol A did not pose a risk to human health. Despite this, a large number of Member States have placed restrictions on the use of this substance in materials that come into contact with food. As a result of this situation, food companies are now having to tailor their packaging to the requirements of individual Member States, thereby incurring higher costs, and there is no longer a single market in food packaging. The Commission has yet to react to this situation; in the meantime, freedom of movement within the EU is being restricted.

- 1. Would the Commission agree that these restrictions on the use of bisphenol A are hampering the free movement of goods within the single market?
- 2. How does it intend to respond to the imposition by some Member States of restrictions on the use of this substance in materials that come into contact with food?
- 3. Is it looking into the possibility of harmonising legislation on food packaging?

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
