Subject: VP/HR - EEAS office in Tehran

The successful conclusion of negotiations with Iran on nuclear proliferation in Vienna has the potential to open a new chapter in relation with Iran and the region, as recently stated by the Vice-President / High Representative.

On 23 August 2015 the Foreign Secretary of the UK, Philip Hammond, reopened the British Embassy in Tehran following its closure in 2011. This is not only a symbolic gesture but also brings the practical benefits of restoring full diplomatic relations, with personnel on the ground. It also marks the first visit of a British Foreign Secretary to Iran in twelve years.

With this example in mind:

- Does the Vice-President / High Representative have plans to establish an EEAS office in Tehran?
- 2. If so, will there be any requirements set in relation to the implementation of the nuclear deal prior to its establishment?
