Question for written answer E-013084/2015 to the Commission Rule 130 Udo Voigt (NI)

Subject: Terrorists among the so-called 'refugees'

Concerns have been expressed that Islamic State, and other terrorist organisations based in the Middle East, could very well exploit the EU's 'open doors' policy for the current migration streams by smuggling in potential terrorists among actual asylum seekers.

- 1. Can the Commission provide an estimate of how many of the migrants entering the EU this year could pose a security threat according to the intelligent services of the Member States?
- 2. Which measures have been taken to minimise the risk of potential terrorists and Islamic fundamentalists exploiting the possibility of entering the EU, given that the EU is not willing to prevent these migration streams?
- 3. Can the Commission recommend any sort of screening process for migrants entering the EU in order to prevent or minimise the risk of importing terrorism or Islamic fundamentalism as a consequence of accepting asylum seekers from the Middle East?
