Subject: Measures for preventing asylum shopping

In recent days, it has been reported that asylum seekers have crossed the German-Danish border and from there have moved on to Sweden. For obvious reasons, it should be evident that not even Germany was their first point of arrival. This is not in compliance with the content of the Dublin Regulation.

- 1. What will the Commission do to make each Member State submit appropriate measures that would allow migrants be registered immediately at their point of first arrival in the EU?
- 2. Would the Commission consider making association agreements with non-member states such as Morocco, Libya and Turkey, so the Dublin Regulation could also be applied there as is the case for other the non-member states such as Norway and Iceland?
- 3. Is the Commission able to provide an estimate of the percentage of the total amount of asylum seekers who are not registered at the first point of arrival in accordance with the Dublin Regulation?
