Subject: Human rights violations in border camps in Hungary

The NGO Human Rights Watch has reported that the situation in border camps in Hungary is 'inhumane and unsustainable' – that much is clear from this Reuters video clip filmed at the Röszke camp: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=n8UuPmYyznQ>. Furthermore, the Hungarian Government has not yet allowed international organisations to enter the border camps to ascertain whether human rights are being upheld.

- Does the Commission believe it is possible to improve reception conditions for people fleeing war and hunger?
- Does the Commission take the view that the Hungarian authorities are upholding EU law in the border camps, specifically as regards respect for human dignity and the prohibition of inhuman treatment as enshrined in Directive 2013/33/EU and Articles 1 and 4 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union on human dignity and the prohibition of torture and inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment?
