Subject: Better collaboration between home affairs bodies

The European Security Agenda recognises the need to work more closely and more effectively with existing EU organisations. The existing bodies in the area of home affairs are: the European Union's Judicial Cooperation Unit (Eurojust), the European Agency for the Management of Operational Cooperation at the External Borders of the Member States of the European Union (Frontex), the European Asylum Support Office (EASO), the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA), the European Union Agency for Network and Information Security (ENISA), the European Agency for the Operational Management of Large-Scale IT Systems in the Area of Freedom, Security and Justice (eu-LISA), the European Police College (CEPOL), the European Police Office (Europol), the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA), the European Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE), the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS), the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF), the EU Counter-Terrorism Coordinator, the EU Anti-Trafficking Coordinator and the EU Intelligence Analysis Centre (EU INTCEN).

Given the number of bodies mentioned above, could the Commission say what it intends to do to improve cooperation between these bodies and with the Member States in order to enhance security?
