Subject: Workers without fixed or habitual places of work

In a recent judgment by the European Court of Justice it was ruled that journeys made by workers without fixed or habitual places of work between their homes and the first and last customer of the day constitute working time, because excluding those journeys from working time would be contrary to the objective of protecting the health and safety of the workers pursued in European Union Law.

Can the Commission give statistics on the number of workers who are employed in this way, where their decision to begin and finish their work-related journey at home – or otherwise – is in fact determined by their employer and not themselves?
