Subject: Spain's unemployment situation

It has recently been reported that Spain has the EU's second-highest unemployment rate for adults who have gained an education. To be specific, 14 % of adults with post-secondary qualifications are unable to find work, compared with the European average of 5.7 %.

In view of this, I would like to know what measures and programmes the Commission intends to introduce, within its remit, in order to address this very high unemployment rate.

As the experts responsible for the OECD and EU research concluded that the Spanish Government should be urged to improve education with a view to achieving more efficient integration in the labour market, what is the Commission's assessment of the instability in the education system on the basis that Spain has introduced new educational legislation every five and a half years since 1980?
