Subject: The EU's involvement in the Syrian conflict

10 October 2015 is marked as the deadliest terror attack in Turkish history. Officials estimate that the twin bombings in Ankara killed 97 individuals and injured more than 500. It has been further stated that ISIL is the prime suspect behind the attack. Military intervention in Syria on behalf of EU Member States has already occurred, an example being the French bombings in September 2015.

Given that Member States are getting more involved in the Syrian conflict, has the Commission carried out an analysis of the situation in terms of the terrorist threat and future bombings that could occur in the EU owing to this involvement?
