Subject: Efficacy of own-initiative (INI) reports

Own-initiative (INI) reports are one of the working tools and political instruments of the European Parliament and offer MEPs the opportunity to explore a diverse range of topics of interest. One of the aims of INI reports is to shape the early phase of the legislative cycle and shape the agenda of the European Union.

According to point 16 of the Framework Agreement, within three months after the adoption of a parliamentary resolution, the Commission should provide Parliament with information in writing on the actions that it has taken in response to specific requests addressed to it in the resolutions of the European Parliament's INI reports.

Can the Commission provide the following figures demonstrating the efficacy of INI reports in shaping the agenda:

How many INI reports, broken down by parliamentary term, have gone on to become part of a proposal?

Which INI reports reach the Commission and go on to shape the agenda, broken down by gender of the rapporteur?
