Subject: Combating radicalisation on the internet and banning the Daesh newspaper

Radicalisation is becoming a major security problem in Europe. One way in which people are radicalised is by being exposed to certain websites, some of which are more difficult to view than others.

To give just one example, Islamic State publishes a newsletter, entitled *Dar al-Islam*, which is easily accessible on the internet. Reading the articles it contains, which consist largely of incitements to discrimination, hatred and murder, is enough to radicalise some people.

It is scandalous that this publication should be so readily accessible, and I am baffled as to why it cannot be banned.
