Subject: Positive mutual recognition of asylum decisions among Member States

Articles 78.2(a) and (b) TFEU provide for the adoption of measures for positive mutual recognition of asylum decisions throughout the Union – a measure that both the Commission and the Council have re-iterated their commitment to on numerous occasions over the past 16 years.

Could the Commission express its view on cases where an individual, after a full and thorough examination of his or her claim, and of any allegations against that individual in his or her country of origin, is granted international protection in one Member State, only to be faced with potential extradition to their country of origin when travelling to another Member State?

Could the Commission clarify what obligations, in terms of consular or other forms of protection, the asylum-granting Member State has with regard to such individuals?

What procedures should be followed by the Member State faced with a demand for extradition?
