Subject: Preventing radicalisation on the internet

On 25 November 2015, Parliament voted overwhelmingly in favour of my report on preventing the radicalisation and recruitment of European citizens by terrorist organisations.

The report calls for internet giants to be made criminally liable for the dissemination of illegal online content which promotes terrorist ideologies and leads to the radicalisation of young people, a measure which is essential if we are to stop the internet being used as a virtual training camp and recruitment centre for terrorists.

1. Will the Commission issue the Member States with guidelines for identifying and removing illegal online content which incites violent extremism?
2. Will it encourage the Member States to prosecute online firms which refuse to cooperate with national authorities?
