Subject: Criminal accountability of net giants

My report on preventing the radicalisation and recruitment of European citizens by terrorist organisations was approved by Parliament with a very large majority on 25 November 2015.

Recognising the criminal accountability of companies active on the internet, social networks and internet service providers in view of the large-scale dissemination of illegal on-line content spreading terrorist propaganda is one of the main measures of the report which I authored and put to the vote. This recognition is crucial if the internet is to stop being a virtual training camp and a means for terrorists to garner recruits.

- 1. Do the Member States intend to adopt binding legislation enabling them to pursue companies active on the internet which do not cooperate adequately with national authorities to eliminate illegal on-line content?
- 2. Will there be EU-level harmonisation of this legislation to ensure that effective measures are implemented throughout the EU?
