Every 90 minutes, somewhere in the world, a woman becomes the victim of an honour killing. In spite of new legislation enacted in 2004, a loophole in Pakistani law makes it possible for men to commit honour killings with impunity.

A draft law abolishing the so-called forgiveness clause, which is the reason honour killings often go unpunished, was tabled, but has unfortunately not yet been implemented.
