Question for written answer E-002860/2016 to the Commission Rule 130 Rachida Dati (PPE)

Subject: Second 'EU anti-corruption report'

On 6 June 2011, the Commission adopted an 'anti-corruption package' comprising four key elements, one of which was a communication on fighting corruption in the Union.

As part of this communication, the Commission stated that it would publish an anti-corruption report in order to monitor and assess Member States' efforts against corruption and help them to take the necessary steps to tackle corruption more effectively. The report aims to promote shared learning and the exchange of best practice.

On 3 February 2014, the Commission published its first anti-corruption report. The 2011 communication stated that a new report would be published every two years after the first report; the second report is therefore due for publication in 2016.

- 1. Can the Commission say what work has been done on the second report so far?
- 2. Given that this report contains an individual analysis of corruption in each Member State, has the Commission measured the impact its first study had in each of the Member States, particularly with regard to the individual recommendations put forward?

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
