Subject: Presence of radicalised individuals in the European institutions

Following the tragic attacks of 22 March in Brussels, the European Parliament confirmed that Najim Laachraoui, one of the suicide bombers at Brussels Airport, worked at the Parliament in 2009 and 2010. His DNA was also found on explosives at the Bataclan in Paris and at the Stade de France. More recently, the German magazine *Der Spiegel* revealed that Parliament has dismissed two drivers who had Islamic State propaganda material in their possession. Article 67 TFEU states that the EU shall endeavour to ensure a high level of security through measures to prevent crime, racism and xenophobia.

- 1. Has the Commission had any similar experience of radicalised individuals having access to its buildings?
- 2. Do the Staff Regulations provide any mechanism for dismissing radicalised individuals?
