Subject: List of actions by the Commission to advance LGBTI equality - foreign affairs

In her 'List of actions by the Commission to advance LGBTI equality', Commissioner Jourová outlines in six chapters the Commission's plans for social engineering and gendering of European societies based on sexual orientation and so-called 'gender identity': non-discrimination, education, employment, health, free movement, asylum, hate speech/hate crime, enlargement and foreign policy. The Commission's global aim is to 'improve the social acceptance of LGBTI people and enforce EU legislation'.

Is the Commission aware that the EU, in its relations with neighbourhood and third countries, has no authority to interpret human rights in ways that create new state obligations or that alter the substance of the treaties with regard to the definition of non-discrimination, marriage and family, and that any measures or changes related to non-discrimination based on sex, sexual orientation or so-called 'gender identity' within the national legal order can only be determined at the national or local level according to the national legislative process?

The Commission's plan is to implement these policies in the EU's external relations.

Could the Commission then translate the 'List of actions to advance LGBTI equality' into all EU official languages and also into Mandarin, Russian, Japanese, Turkish and Arabic?
