Subject: Cooperation between Member States and Europol on information exchange

At their latest hearings before the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs, both the Council's Counter-Terrorism Coordinator and the Director-General of Europol stressed that much still needed to be done to improve the exchange of intelligence between Member States on counter-terrorism.

They stressed in particular that not all Member States were connected to the Siena platform's counterterrorism area and that there was still too little contribution to and use of 'Focal Point Travellers' by many Member States.

The exchange of intelligence is vital in counter-terrorism. There must be no let-up in strengthening cooperation between Member States. Any delay could have disastrous consequences.

That being so, can the Commission state:

- whether all Member States are now connected to the counter-terrorism area of the Siena platform set up by Europol?
- how many people have been registered in 'Focal Point Travellers', and what has been the level of contribution to and use of this information exchange tool by Member States?
