Subject: Commission resolution on Sogepsa (Asturias)

While developing the La Magdalena secondary school in Avilés, Asturias, Sogepsa, a vehicle company for the Autonomous Government of Asturias specialising in semipublic, urban and residential development projects, may have violated EU legislation by awarding plots of land directly rather than issuing open calls for tender.

The following complaints were lodged about a possible breach of EU internal market and free competition legislation by Spain, on the part of Sogepsa in Asturias:

- Complaints were lodged on 1 March 2010 by José María García García and co., and by Francisco José Sánchez González and co., represented in both cases by Raúl Bocanegra Sierra.
- A complaint referenced as 3346/2012/MARK was lodged on 27 June 2011.

The infringement procedure launched by the Commission has now been ongoing for 5 years.

1. Why has the Commission not yet taken a decision?
2. How long is a judgement expected to take?
3. Have new commitments been made to correct Spain's infringements, or are penalties envisaged?
