Question for written answer E-004495/2016 to the Commission Rule 130 Norbert Erdős (PPE)

Subject: Excessive quantities of antibiotics in by-products of bioethanol

In its reply to my Written Question E-012833/2015, tabled last September, the Commission stated that, since the first detection of antibiotic residues in bio-ethanol by-products at EU borders in 2008, the Commission had received nine notifications on excessive levels of an antibiotic in by-products of bio-ethanol production, mainly in animal feed.

- 1. In the light of EU legislation and current scientific knowledge, what is the limit value above which the quantity of antibiotics in animal feed may be regarded as excessive?
- 2. Exactly what levels of antibiotic residues were found in the nine cases in which excessive quantities of antibiotics in by-products of bioethanol were found at the EU's external borders?
- 3. What proportion (what percentage) of animal feed imported into the EU is inspected for its antibiotic content at the EU's external borders?
