## Question for written answer E-004544/2016/rev.1 to the Commission Rule 130 Jørn Dohrmann (ECR)

Subject: Nuclear-proof shelters for people linked to the EU institutions

Following the Islamist terrorist attack on 22 March 2016, ominous news has emerged in the media about, inter alia, the very unsafe Belgian nuclear power plants, where leaks have been found and, in general, safety levels are poor. At the same time, sabotage attempts have been made, increasing the risk of nuclear leakage.

For some reason, the Government of Belgium recently opted to issue iodine tablets to the country's population. In other words, there are indications of an increased threat level.

There is a plan, of course, to evacuate EU authorities and institutions in the event of a serious terrorist attack on a nuclear plant; and, naturally, every national authority has an equivalent contingency plan.

Are there nuclear-proof shelters available for persons linked to the Commission, i.e. staff, Commissioners and others, including visiting persons?

Where are the nuclear-proof shelters located for the Commission?

Is the Commission taking steps to provide instruction and guidance on what to do in the event of an attack or leakage at one of the nuclear plants?
