Subject: The CETC ROUTE65 Central European Corridor in the TEN-T network of pan-European

transport corridors

The CETC corridor consists of multimodal transport routes: rail, road and inland waterways ensuring fast and separated transport of people and goods. In Poland, the transport links forming the CETC are: the S3 road (the E65 international road), the E59 and C-E59 railway lines ('Nadodrzanka') and the entire length of the Oder river, with the possibility of extending to the Danube-Oder Canal. On 12 December 2013, signatures were submitted on behalf of the partners in the CETC-ROUTE65 initiative to establish, under the new formula, a Central European Transport Corridor - European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation, which includes the regions in the countries lying along its route. This was first transport grouping in the European Union.

The corridor would provide a platform for regional development along its entire length. It would comply in full with the intermodality principle and would have a sustainable impact on the natural environment. It would have the positive effect of increasing the pace of socio-economic development in a large part of the European Union by increasing the speed and volume of trade between the countries of the Baltic region and the Mediterranean and Adriatic countries.

- 1. When will the TEN-T network next be revised? Is that revision expected to include the CETC corridor in the existing TEN-T network of pan-European transport corridors?
- 2. What legal and infrastructure boundary conditions must the CETC-EGTC initiative meet in order for the CETC-ROUTE65 to be taken into account in the work to include it in the TEN-T network?
