Question for written answer E-006540/2016 to the Commission Rule 130 Anneleen Van Bossuyt (ECR)

Subject: Recognition of professions in other Member States

Last year we tabled a question to the Commission concerning the recognition of professions in other Member States. The question was illustrated by the example of a skiing instructor. At the time, the Commission stated that it would help all Member States to transpose Directive 2013/55/EU. Today, exactly one year after that answer, we understand from a statement by a Commission representative that some Member States have still not succeeded in notifying the Commission of measures to transpose Directive 2013/55/EU. As a result, people in certain professions are still encountering problems in exercising their professions in other Member States.

- 1. Article 3 of Directive 2013/55/EU stipulates that Member States must transpose the Directive by 18 January 2016. Which Member States have not yet succeeded in doing so?
- 2. What will the Commission do to ensure that the Directive is fully transposed in all EU Member States as soon as possible?
- 3. A year ago, the Commission was already conducting an inquiry into France. What is the state of play with regard to the infringement proceedings which were launched against that Member State?
