At a gala dinner hosted by the German employers' association in Hamburg on Wednesday, 26 October 2016, Günther Oettinger, the German Commissioner for the digital economy, made a series of comments that were unworthy of the office he holds. Not only did Mr Oettinger appear to express disappointment at the progress made in respect of gay marriage, but he also made offensive comments about my region, Wallonia, dubbing it 'a micro-region run by Communists' that was blocking the whole of Europe.
