Subject: The new anti-dumping methodology (NOMAD)

On 9 November 2016, the Commission proposed a new anti-dumping methodology (NOMAD). In its proposal, the Commission puts forward the aim of setting up a database comprising reports and benchmarks on a number of sectors and in a number of countries. These studies will require a great deal of human and financial resources.

1. Does the Commission have the necessary human and financial resources for such a task?
2. What will these studies be based on: an internal database using the Commission's anti-dumping experience or an external database with the help of reports by other institutions or bodies?
3. What will the content and layout of the benchmarks be?
