Question for written answer E-000066/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Marie-Christine Arnautu (ENF)

Subject: Link between air safety and the lack of job security for some pilots

The London School of Economics and Eurocontrol published a joint study at the end of 2016 entitled "European pilots' perceptions of safety culture in European Aviation". This survey of 7 239 commercial pilots highlighted their concerns over understaffing and the risks this could entail for flight safety. The study also revealed that over half of them (58 %) had flown while tired and that pilots employed by low-cost companies or cargo airlines complain even more of fatigue. It is worth recalling here that Ghent University drew attention to the heightened risk of pilots being employed on short-term contracts and seeing their working conditions worsen, particularly if working for low-cost companies, in a report published in 2015 entitled 'Atypical Employment in Aviation'.

- 1. Does the Commission believe that as the aforementioned studies would seem to suggest, lack of job security may influence some pilots' decision-making, affecting flight safety as a consequence?
- 2. Does it plan to alter EU regulations, taking the observations and recommendations made in these studies into account?
- 3. Will it take steps to prevent atypical jobs and short-term contracts from becoming commonplace in the aviation sector?

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
