Question for written answer E-000495/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Franck Proust (PPE)

Subject: Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) negotiations

The new US President, Donald Trump, has made closing down the negotiations on a trade agreement with the EU one of the central planks of a new foreign policy doctrine. There is therefore much uncertainty over the future of EU-US trade relations, in particular TTIP, about which many wild claims have been made. This negotiating framework set up in 2008 provides a forum for discussions that are essential in order to protect Europe's commercial interests and our demanding economic, social and environmental standards.

- 1. What discussions have there been between the Commission and the new Trump administration, in particular the Office of the United States Trade Representative?
- 2. Will the Commission push for the continuation or the termination of the TTIP negotiations?
- 3. What steps would the EU need to take vis-à-vis the United States in order to shut down the trade agreement process?
