## Question for written answer E-000834/2017/rev.1 to the Commission (Vice-President / High Representative) Rule 130 Franz Obermayr (ENF)

Subject: VP/HR - Possible suppression of freedom of opinion in Kiev

In September 2016, the Ukrainian Government adopted a bill imposing a ban on the import of books with 'anti-Ukrainian content'. The bill was directed primarily against government-critical literature from Russia. The ban also affects a number of Russian television stations, which are subject to a broadcasting and reception ban. One of the reasons given by the Ukrainian Government for these bans is the alleged incompatibility between the European Convention on Transfrontier Television and Ukrainian law.

- 1. Does the VP/HR take the view that the bans are consistent with the freedom of opinion and information enshrined in Article 10 of the European Convention on Human Rights, a freedom which, according to Article 6(3) TEU, is one of the values underpinning the European Union?
- 2. If not, what steps can be taken to prevent further infringement of these rights?
- 3. What view does the VP/HR take of the alleged incompatibility between the provisions of the European Convention on Transfrontier Television and Ukrainian law?
