Subject: The Digital Agenda for Europe

The Digital Agenda for Europe set a number of specific targets with a view to enabling members of the public and businesses to take full advantage of the benefits of information and communication technologies. Those targets included:

- ensuring broadband coverage throughout the EU by 2013;
- ensuring broadband coverage at 30 Mbps or more throughout the EU by 2020;
- ensuring that 50% of broadband subscriptions were above 100 Mbps by 2015;
- ensuring that 50% of the population were buying online by 2015;
- ensuring that 20 % of the population were making cross-border purchases online by 2015;
- phasing out differences between national and roaming tariffs by 2015 (ultimately 2017);
- increasing regular internet use from 60% to 75% by 2015 and from 41% to 60% for people with disabilities;
- halving the proportion of the population that has never used the internet from 30% to 15% by 2015;
- ensuring that 50% of the public were using eGovernment services by 2015;
- ensuring that all key cross-border public services were available online by 2015;
- doubling public RDI investment in ICT to total EUR 11 billion by 2020;
- cutting energy use on lighting to 2% by 2020.

Could the Commission state the extent to which each of those targets has been met?
