Subject: Killing of human rights defenders in Colombia

While the Colombian government is denying that the killing of human rights defenders is systematic, the number of murders is increasing: at least 14 cases were recorded between 1 January and 6 February 2017. There are also numerous reports of threats and attacks by neo-paramilitaries, who are stepping up their presence in areas previously controlled by the FARC. The state's response remains inadequate and it is failing to provide the necessary human rights guarantees, a cornerstone for building peace. One example is the Urabá region, where the San José de Apartadó Peace Community, a finalist for the 2011 Sakharov Prize, and the Cacarica humanitarian zones are reporting incursions and attacks by neo-paramilitaries on a daily basis.

- 1. Is the Commission considering devoting part of the Trust Fund to the implementation of point 3.4 of the Final Agreement on victims, guarantees and the dismantling of paramilitary organisations?
- 2. Is the Commission considering creating a mechanism, mainly comprising civil society, to monitor and assess the implementation of the fund?
- 3. Is the EU planning to devote part of the fund to finance civil society directly, without it being subject to the requirements of the Colombian authorities?
