Subject: Human rights violations in Hungary

Violations of democracy and human rights by the Hungarian Government continue to escalate. This week we learned that Hungary recruited nearly 3 000 'migrant hunters' to form a militia to patrol its border. These 'migrant hunters', who belong to neither the police force nor the military, will be entitled to carry firearms, truncheons, pepper spray and handcuffs.

- 1. How much longer will the Commission tolerate Viktor Orbán and his government's attacks on the rule of law, political freedom and democracy, and on the work of non-governmental organisations?
- 2. What is the Commission view's on the recruitment by a Member State of 'migrant hunters', authorised to carry firearms, truncheons, pepper spray and handcuffs?
- 3. If the Commission considers penalising Member States for failing to meet deficit targets by suspending EU funds to those countries, does it not think that such a penalty could be more justifiably imposed on a Member State that has repeatedly and without fear of the consequences violated human rights within the EU?
