Subject: Threat posed by Islamists in Montenegro

The 2016 Commission progress report on Montenegro (2016/2309(INI)) and Charles Tannock's report (A8-0050/2017), which was debated on Wednesday, 15 March 2017 at the part-session in Strasbourg, concern Montenegro's efforts to become a full EU Member State. The *Süddeutsche Zeitung¹* has reported that Islamic State (IS) and other Islamist groups are operating recruitment camps in Montenegro. In addition, *Bayerischer Rundfunk²* has reported that Montenegrin arms smugglers are constantly being arrested at the Bayarian border.

- 1. Is the Commission aware of the threat posed by Islamists in Montenegro?
- 2. If so, why did this matter go unmentioned in its progress report?
- 3. How does the Commission intend to prevent arms smuggling if Montenegro becomes a full Member State?
