Subject: The increasing manifestations of neo-Nazism, fascism and nationalism

A highly disturbing increase in manifestations of neo-Nazism, fascism and nationalism has become the reality for Europe, including in EU Member States. I could mention in this context, for example, the legally active and organised fascist forces in Ukraine, openly espousing Nazism, the traditions of Hitler's SS and militant nationalism, and also the annual and completely unrestricted marches of SS veterans in Latvia or the unmistakable authoritarian and nationalistic trends in Poland, Hungary and elsewhere. This phenomenon is directly connected with efforts to revise the Second World War settlements adopted by the victorious powers of the anti-Hitler alliance, including opening up ownership and other issues, as certain forces in Hungary are now attempting to do against Slovakia.

Is the Commission aware of these developments?

If so, how does the Commission view them, and what measures does it intend to take or initiate to suppress them?
