Subject: VP/HR - Transatlantic relations following the Taormina G7 summit

The 2017 G7 summit was held in Taormina, Italy, on 26-27 May and brought together the Heads of State or Government of Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the United Kingdom and the United States. The European Union was represented by the President of the Council, Donald Tusk, and the President of the Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker.

The position of the United States vis-à-vis many of the most pressing global issues meant that the leaders were unable to issue a bold and ambitious political text on priorities of the utmost concern, including migration and climate change.

How will the disagreements at the most recent G7 summit affect EU-US relations?

In what way will the differences which arose during the summit be reflected in EU transatlantic policy and in future cooperation with the current US administration?
