Subject: Squandering of tax payers' money on the Europe House in Paris

A report on the website of Politico¹ refers to forthcoming conversion work at the Europe House in Paris. This project is said to be costing EUR 12 million, including a rental contract which will cost a cool EUR 6 million per annum, with the bill to be footed by the taxpayer. This is yet one more item on the already lengthy list of money-wasting projects organised by the out-of-touch European elite.

- 1. How many 'Europe Houses' are there, how many people visit them and how much do they cost to run each year?
- 2. How will replacing a rental contract costing 'only' EUR 1.7 million per annum with one costing EUR 6 million per annum help to bring the European Union closer to its citizens?
- 3. Does the Commission agree that all those millions ought to be given back to net-contributing Member States, preferably the Netherlands?
