Question for written answer E-005199/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 André Elissen (ENF)

Subject: Commissioners' travel expenses

After many years of litigation<sup>1</sup> the Belgian magazine Knack has finally been allowed, with others, to inspect Commissioners' expenses declarations. These show<sup>2</sup> that, in the first two months of 2016 alone, half a million euros were spent on travel and accommodation. The most expensive trip cost over EUR 75 000 for a visit lasting barely three days.

- 1. Why was it apparently necessary to wait three years before these declarations were published?
- 2. In the interest of transparency towards the European public, can the Commission publish a summary of all Commissioners' accommodation and travel costs during the current parliamentary term (since 2014), and is it prepared to publish a monthly summary in future?
- 3. Does the Commission consider it acceptable, and defensible to the European taxpayer, that High Representative Mogherini declared EUR 75 000 for a trip lasting barely three days to Baku, and what did this journey achieve?
