Subject: Vaccine safety

Vaccines contain aluminium, squalene, antibiotics and polysorbate, among other chemical components. They also produce side effects and are subject to contraindications and many adverse secondary effects can appear after vaccination; in some cases these can be fatal.

1. Does the Commission not think that providing information to families and medical personnel on all the potential secondary effects of every component in a vaccine should be obligatory, and that vaccines should only be given on the basis of a pre-vaccine form drawn up by a medical association which establishes informed consent?
2. Would the Commission not agree that no Member State should force its citizens to undergo a medical procedure with inherent risks and that vaccination should not be compulsory in any Member State, given that no one has been able to prove that vaccines are safe?
