Question for written answer E-007224/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Xabier Benito Ziluaga (GUE/NGL)

Subject: Retortillo uranium mine - environmental impact assessments and economic viability

At the start of 2017, Berkeley Minera España S.L. began building a uranium mine in the municipal districts of Retortillo and Villavieja de Yeltes (province of Salamanca). The works have been at a standstill since then.

- 1. Does the Commission believe that the environmental impact assessment provided for in Directive 2011/92/EU ensures that companies properly evaluate the impact of radioactive material on the environment?
- 2. Given that the project is about 30 km from the border with Portugal and the Portuguese Environment Agency published a report on 30 May 2016 in which it concluded that 'the Retortillo-Santidad uranium-mining project (Salamanca, Spain), could have significant environmental effects on Portugal', has an environmental impact assessment been carried out within the framework of the Espoo Convention?
- 3. Taking into account that some mining projects have been pursued for speculative purposes and the Spanish state-owned company Empresa Nacional del Uranio S.A. has questioned the profitability of the site, will the Commission ask Berkeley Minera España S.L. to provide it with a study on the economic viability of the project?
