Question for written answer E-007810/2017 to the Commission Rule 130 Dominique Martin (ENF)

Subject: Imports from New Zealand and the implications for employment in Europe

On 13 September 2017, the Commission presented a draft free trade agreement with New Zealand.

A study by Parliament has revealed that 'offal and animal fats' account for 5% of agricultural imports from New Zealand¹. What are these products used for?

The main services exported from New Zealand to the EU are 'other personal travel services'<sup>2</sup>. Which services fall into this category?

Environmentally, it would be absurd to have boats transport poor-quality wine, cider and vinegar to Europe across 30 000 kilometres of ocean for 60 days while our own vessels travel in the opposite direction with our high-quality wines, and it would be nothing but unfair to pit our traditionally-sized farms against the huge post-colonial estates in New Zealand<sup>3</sup>.

Has the Commission calculated how many jobs would be lost in the European farming industry if the agreement were to be ratified?
