## Question for written answer E-000021/2018 to the Commission Rule 130

Subject: Rule of law in Spain

Spanish judge Jaime Conejo Heredia, who recently took over the investigation into events surrounding the 1 October referendum, has publicly declared, on social media, his disapproval of the democratic Catalan pro-separatist movement and his highly pro-Spanish leanings<sup>1</sup>.

His Facebook profile contained numerous posts indicating a clear stance against the independence movement<sup>2 3 4</sup>. When the information began to go viral, he decided to shut down his Facebook account<sup>5</sup>.

The behaviour of judge Jaime Conejo Heredia is a clear indication that the rule of law does not work with full guarantees in Spain.

- Does the Commission consider the behaviour of Mr Jaime Conejo Heredia to be befitting of an impartial judge?
- 2. Does the Commission still consider that it has no indication that the guarantees provided for in Spain's national legal system are not sufficient to protect the rule of law effectively?
- 3. What will the Commission do to ensure that Spain respects the independence of the judiciary?
