Subject: Suspected women members of IS returning home

According to a report in the 'Standard' of 25 December 2017, a dispute arose concerning women with Tunisian passports, possibly from Syria or Iraq, who are suspected of being returning members of IS. This led to a temporary cessation of flights by the airline 'Emirates' between Tunisia and the United Arab Emirates.

- 1) Does the Commission know whether any holders of Tunisian passports posing a potential threat similar to that described above entered the European Union in late December 2017 or early January 2018?
- 2) Does the Commission have any data concerning dual citizenship of asylum seekers entering the EU, for example from Syria?
- 3) If so, how many asylum seekers have dual citizenship?
