## Question for written answer E-001474/2018 to the Commission Rule 130 Dominique Martin (ENF)

Subject: Lithuania is emptying and yet the Commission continues to advocate worker mobility in Europe

Since joining NATO<sup>1</sup> and then the EU in 2004<sup>2</sup>, Lithuania has lost 16% of its population (source: World Bank and Eurostat<sup>3</sup>). If the same phenomenon had occurred in France<sup>4</sup>, it would have lost 10.5 million people. At this rate, there will soon be no one left in the country.

The Commission has earmarked EUR 27.5 billion (2014-2020) from the European Social Fund (ESF) for initiatives supporting worker mobility in Europe<sup>5</sup>. This fund is being used to subsidise the disappearance of the population of a Member State.

Above what threshold would the Commission consider that a Member State is threatened with extinction and must stop encouraging population movements?
