Subject: Additional measures to tackle unemployment

Unemployment among Europe's young people has soared by 50 % since the financial crisis of 2008. It is rising faster than overall jobless rates, and almost half of young people in work across the EU do not have permanent jobs. 50 % of unemployed people in the European Union aged between 20 and 34 are reluctant to change their place of residence for a job, while 21 % are ready to move for a job but only in the same country, and 12 % would consider moving to another EU Member State. 17 % would even be ready to move outside the EU for a job. High unemployment rates in some Member States, especially among young people, remain a key concern.

Although the Commission has proposed renewed efforts to support young people with better opportunities to access employment, better opportunities through education and training and better opportunities to benefit from solidarity, learning mobility and participation, this problem nevertheless continues to exist.

What additional measures will the Commission consider in order to reinforce the existing efforts and achieve the expected results?
