Subject: Judicial cooperation between Member States in criminal matters

The European Treaties guarantee equality between Member States, protecting national identities and territorial integrity. They also enshrine the principle of sincere cooperation, by which Member States should respect and help each other, and which covers judicial cooperation in the form of the execution of European Arrest Warrants.

Will the Commission promote reforms to further the principle of mutual recognition in line with Article 82 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and specifically, the inclusion of the crimes of sedition, high treason and rebellion as infringements under Article 2 of Council Framework Decision 2002/584?

How effective does it consider the current guarantees under the EU's legal and political framework to be in safeguarding the constitutional order and territorial integrity of Member States against attempts to undermine them?
