Subject: Growing suicide risk in middle-aged men

According to recent studies in western countries¹, a fairly new demographic pattern is showing that middle-aged men are currently the age group with the highest risk of suicide.

Considering that i) reducing the number of suicides; and ii) promoting targeted interventions for the most vulnerable groups are among the priorities identified by the European Framework for Action on Mental Health and Wellbeing (2016)²:

- 1. Can the Commission confirm that this demographic pattern is also present in EU Member States, and if so, which ones?
- 2. Does the Commission know what targeted interventions are being used in an attempt to prevent suicide among middle-aged European men, and is the effectiveness of these interventions being measured?
