Subject: Premature release or parole for convicted prisoners who have been radicalised

On 5 July 2018, the Special Committee on Terrorism submitted a draft report setting out its 'findings and recommendations' (2018/2044 (INI)).

Prepared with input from Eurojust and Europol, the report – albeit still at draft stage – expresses concern about 'inadequate sentences being issued for serious crime and radicalised individuals being released prematurely or on parole'¹.

Given the significance of this comment and the need for further details and figures to inform future discussion of the matter, can the Commission specify:

- (1) in what circumstances it considers that a radicalised individual has been released 'prematurely'?
- (2) the breakdown by Member State of incidences of radicalised convicted prisoners being released prematurely?
- (3) how many radicalised convicted prisoners (according to its figures or those of Eurojust) have been released on parole since 2008?
